- B. Planning to attend either a technical college, community college or a 4-year university/college after high school (preference given to technical or community college)
- C. GPA considered
- D. Financial need considered

Application Procedures:

Brett Allsop Memorial Scholarship

Brett Allsop was born and raised in Bellingham. He attended Sehome High where he competed in Cross Country and Track. He won the state Cross Country meet in 1987 and had numerous awards in Track and Field as well. After Sehome, Brett attended Stanford University where he competed again in Cross Country and Track. At Stanford, Brett majored in industrial engineering and technology. Upon graduating he founded an internet company, FogDog Sports. The company went public and Brett became Chairman. He then moved his family to London to start FogDog in Europe. FogDog was subsequently bought by Global Sports. Brett then became an internet technology advisor to the British government. He also worked as a venture capitalist with the firm Amadeus in London. As his family grew Brett, decided that he wanted to raise his children in his beloved hometown. He returned to Bellingham and began to work in the Allsop family businesses. He was President of the tech arm of the company. During this time he and his brother, Ryan, also founded an internet travel site, YAPTA (Your Amazing Personal Travel Assistant). Brett was a member of Young President's Organization (YPO). Brett's other hobbies included skiing, kayaking, boating, reading and, of course, running.

Brett was killed in a car accident in August of 2009.

The Brett Allsop Memorial Scholarship was made possible by generous donations from his family, his friends and his business associates. It is their hope that his life will inspire students to become business entrepreneurs particularly in the fields of math, science and technology.



Restrictions to the Brett Allsop Memorial Scholarship

The distributable amount of the Fund will be used to award one or more annual scholarships. These monies may be used for tuition, housing, books and/or fees.

Selection criteria utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:

- Senior graduating from any Bellingham High School
- Planning to attend either a community college or a 4-yr university/college after high school
- GPA of 3.5 or better
- Financial Need considered
- Student demonstrating:
 - ability in math, science, or technology
 - Entrepreneurial or creative ability
- Planning to major in the sciences or business
- Financial need considered
- Participation in high school sports considered

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Whatcom Community Foundation, in collaboration with the Allsop Family (the Donors), determines that specific changes are necessary.

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The FIRS Scholarship

The Firs scholarship was established by the Firs, Camp Firwood and Fircreek Day Camp. This scholarship is intended to honor a deserving young person who has served on the summer staff at the Firs Summer Camps, thus devoting their entire summer to the service of children participating in their summer programs.

Restrictions to The Firs Scholarship

The fund will award one or more annual scholarships of \$1,000. These monies can be used for tuition, books, and/or fees.

Selection criteria utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:

- A. A graduate of one of Bellingham's four high schools (Bellingham, Squaticum, Sehome or Options)
- B. Served on The Firs summer staff at Camp Firwood or Fircreek Day Camp during the summer preceding the award.
- C. Maintains a GPA of 2.5 or above

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with The Firs, determines that specific changes are necessary.

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Tim & Leslie Farris Scholarship

The Tim and Leslie Farris Scholarship was established to promote the education of a student who has lived in foster care at some point in his/her life, or who has overcome a difficult life situation. Tim Farris is an attorney who has represented the rights of foster children for 15 years in his law practice. Leslie's background is in school counseling and she feels strongly that students can succeed when they know that adults believe in them and their abilities. Together, they would like to encourage young adults from challenging backgrounds to continue to follow their dreams and aspirations for a brighter future through education.

Restrictions to Tim & Leslie Farris Scholarship

The fund will award one or more annual scholarships of \$1,000. These monies can be used for tuition, books, and/or fees.

Selection criteria utilized in by the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Awards Committee in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:

- Senior graduate of any Bellingham high school
- To attend a University/4-yr College, Whatcom Community College, or Bellingham Technical College
- Motivated student who has been in foster care or who comes from challenging circumstances as confirmed by his/her school counselor
- Financial need

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Whatcom Community Foundation, in collaboration with the Farris Family (the Donors), determines that specific changes are necessary.

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Gage Yates Memorial Scholarship

The Gage Yates Memorial Scholarship is a scholarship fund established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars dedicated to support high school graduates in their interest in automobiles. Gage Yates was a wonderful young man, who always enjoyed anything with wheels and a potential for speed. Whether it was skateboarding, motorcycles, or cars, he was always seeking a way to improve performance and handling. Most importantly, he had fun experimenting and trying new automotive designs until the project was “just right”. He was talented, energetic, and fun. Gage’s parents hope to help young people, like Gage, learn more about automobiles so they can experience the challenges, opportunities, and fun they have to offer. They are happy to know that others are doing the things that Gage loved best.

Restrictions to the Gage Yates Memorial Scholarship

1. The Fund will award three scholarships of \$1,000 each to be distributed to students attending college during the 2010-2011 academic year.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. A graduating senior from either Bellingham, Sehome, Squalicum, or Options High School
 - B. A student planning to study either:
 - Automotive Technology, Diesel Technology, or Auto Body Collision Repair at Bellingham Technical College
 - Industry Technology – Vehicle Design at Western Washington University
3. **Application Procedures:** Students should apply using the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars application available in mid-winter 2010.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with Robin & Leslie Yates, determines specific changes are necessary.

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WITH CAUSES THAT MATTER

John Warden Memorial Music Scholarship

The John Warden Memorial Music Scholarship is a scholarship established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars in memory of John Warden, a former music teacher with the Bellingham School District. John received a B.A. in Music from the University of Montana in 1938. In 1940, John and his helpmate, Helen Reis, were married in Harlowton, Montana, where he began a decade-long career teaching music. John spent three years in the Army during WWII serving in Europe, afterward returning to teach music in Orting, WA. He received an M.A. in Music Education from Western Washington University in 1950 and began teaching music in Bellingham, where he continued to teach for five decades.

After his retirement, John continued to volunteer in many schools, including Shuksan and Fairhaven Middle Schools, Seminary of Christ the King in Mission, B.C., and Assumption Catholic School. He was an active member of First Presbyterian Church where he sang in the choir, taught Sunday School, and directed the English hand-bell choir for many years. Performing with the Bellingham High School Alumni Band held a special place in his heart. He received many awards and much recognition city-and state-wide for his dedication and service to young people and to music education.

Restrictions to the John Warden Memorial Music Scholarship

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of at least \$500.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. Senior graduating from one of Bellingham School District's high schools
 - B. Planning to attend a 4-yr university/college
 - C. Planning to major in music education – preferably instrumental music
 - D. GPA considered but not primary consideration
 - E. Financial need considered
3. Application Procedures: applicants should complete the BDFS application.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Nast/Warden Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Lori Poad Memorial Scholarship

The Lori Poad Memorial Fund is a scholarship fund established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars in memory of Lori Poad. Lori taught math to students at Shuksan Middle School. She was known for her dedication to support students who were struggling with math.

Restrictions to the Lori Poad Memorial Scholarship

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of at least \$1,000.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. A graduating senior from one of Bellingham's four high schools (Bellingham, Sehome, Squalicum, or Options)
 - B. Attended Shuksan Middle School
 - C. Planning to major in math-related field (math instruction/education, architecture, construction, engineering, etc.) in college
 - D. 3.3 GPA or better

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Poad Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Macpherson Math and Music Scholarship

The Macpherson Family's Math and Music Scholarship was established by John and Cheryl Macpherson in gratitude for their three sons' education from kindergarten through graduation in Bellingham schools. The sons shared interests both in math and music.

Restrictions to the Macpherson Math and Music Scholarship

The fund will award one or more annual scholarships of \$1,000. These monies can be used for tuition, books, room and board and/or fees.

Selection criteria utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:

- A. A graduate of one of Bellingham's four high schools (Bellingham, Squaticum, Sehome or Options)
- B. Demonstrates above ordinary interest in math or music

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Donors, determines that specific changes are necessary.

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Margie and Steve Kimberley Scholarship

The Margie and Steve Kimberley Scholarship is a scholarship established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars. Margie Kimberley taught English, Drama, and Leadership within the Bellingham Schools. Margie emphasized to students that character and integrity are essential qualities in today's world.

Restrictions to the Margie and Steve Kimberley Scholarship

1. The award will be an annual scholarship of \$1,000.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. Senior graduating from one of Bellingham's four high schools (Bellingham, Squalicum, Sehome or Options)
 - B. Students planning to attend any post-high school educational opportunities.
 - C. Financial Need
 - D. 2.5 GPA minimum
 - E. Selection committee places emphasis on character; previews and provides family with top five applicants. Applications do not include students' names. Family will recommend a blind first and second choice back to the Awards Committee for their final decision.

3. **Application Procedures:**

In addition to the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars application form, the student will submit:

- A. a short three paragraph **Character Reflection**
(see attached - **Character Reflection** / Kimberley Scholarship)
- B. one additional **reference** (recommendation) that focuses on student's character
(see attached - **Character Reference** / Kimberley Scholarship)

Turn these two completed pieces in with the completed BDFS application to your career center by the deadline specified on the BDFS application.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with Margie and Steve Kimberley, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Pat and Stan Smith Engineering Scholarship

The Pat & Stan Smith Engineering Scholarship is a scholarship fund established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars dedicated to encouraging students to earn an engineering degree. Stan attended a community college for two years and then transferred to a state university where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in engineering. He later obtained a Masters Degree in Civil Engineering and spent his career working for the engineering firm of CH2M Hill.

Restrictions to the Pat and Stan Smith Engineering Scholarship

1. The Fund will award a scholarship of \$1,000 to be distributed for students attending college during the 2008-2009 academic year.
2. Selection criteria utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. A graduating senior from either Bellingham, Sehome, Squalicum, or Options High School
 - B. A student planning to major in engineering, initially attending either a community college or a 4-year university/college in the state of Washington.
 - C. Financial need and GPA considered with strong consideration given to academic improvement.

3. Application Procedures:

In addition to the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars application form, the student will submit:

- A. A **single paragraph** explaining why you have chosen to pursue a career in engineering, *and*
- B. A **single paragraph** indicating what the scholarship would mean to you, *and*
- C. Some indication of family income or need.

Applicants need to turn these 3 completed pieces in with the completed BDFS application to your career center by the deadline specified on the BDFS application.

Interview: The Scholarship Awards Committee will review the completed applications and submit to Pat and Stan Smith four to six applications. These four to six applicants will then participate in an interview to select the one scholarship recipient.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with Pat & Stan Smith, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Settlemyer Family Scholarship

The Settlemyer Family Scholarship is a scholarship fund established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars dedicated to encouraging students to earn a technical certificate or degree. Earl Settlemyer, active member of our community and member of the Bellingham Technical College Foundation, believes strongly in providing young people with the opportunity to gain the skills and technical expertise necessary to fill the high-demand/high-wage jobs available to graduates of Bellingham Technical College.

Restrictions to the Settlemyer Family Scholarship

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of \$1,000.
2. **Selection** criteria utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. A graduating senior from either Bellingham, Sehome, Squalicum, or Options High School
 - B. A student planning to attend Bellingham Technical College

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Settlemyer Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Paul Clarke Memorial Scholarship

In memory of Paul Clark, a memorial scholarship will be awarded to one Bellingham High School senior planning to pursue a career that is dedicated to helping others. Upon his death, Paul Clarke's family, wanting to honor his legacy, established the Paul Clarke Memorial Scholarship. Mr. Clarke was closely connected to Bellingham High School and was someone who committed his life's work to caring for others. His work included teaching in Whatcom County, serving as a social service provider, as well as working with disabled children and adults. The purpose of this scholarship is to reward current accomplishments and encourage the future spirit of service of the recipient.

The Fund will award a scholarship of \$4,000 to be distributed to a student attending college during the 2010-2011 academic year.

1. To be eligible to apply:

- A. Applicant shall be a Bellingham High School senior
- B. Demonstrate current efforts in regards to serving and assisting others
- C. Demonstrate leadership of character
- D. Plan to pursue a career dedicated to service
- E. Has been accepted, or is in the process of applying to a community college, technical/vocational college, or university

2. **Application Procedures:** In addition to completing the regular Bellingham Dollars for Scholars application, the student will submit:

- A. A **single paragraph** describing your commitment to service and how you hope to give back to your community in the future *and*
- B. A **single paragraph** stating your plans as they relate to your educational and career objectives and future goals, *and*
- C. A **single paragraph** describing how and when any unusual family or personal circumstances have affected your achievement in school, work experience, or your participation in school and community activities.

Applicants need to turn these 3 completed pieces in with the completed BDFS application to your Career Center by the deadline specified on the BDFS application.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with The Clarke Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Bob and Echo Dorr Scholarship

Bob Dorr taught at Bellingham High School for over 30 years. As the P.E. teacher, and counselor, Bob mentored tens of thousands of young people. As the Head Track & Field Coach for many years, Bob saw many of his athletes earn state and regional records. Bob's wife, Echo, taught Foreign Language at Bellingham High. Their love of athletics and their musical talents are legendary in the entire community of Bellingham.

The distributable amount of the Fund will be used to award one or more annual scholarships. These monies may be used for tuition, housing, books and/or fees.

Selection criteria utilized in by the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Awards Committee in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:

- Senior graduate of Bellingham High School
- For post-secondary education
- Interest in pursuing a degree in education
- Students with financial Need (families with less than \$50,000 annual income)
- GPA considered

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Whatcom Community Foundation, in collaboration with the Dorr Family (the Donors), determines that specific changes are necessary.

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Roy and Carol Ericsson Scholarship

The Roy and Carol Ericsson Scholarship is a scholarship fund established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars honoring the life work of Roy and Carol Ericsson. Roy taught middle school and high school science and for many years was a Counselor at Sehome High School. Carol taught Physical Education and was a Counselor at Bellingham High School. Both were instrumental in establishing the Leadership Programs at both Bellingham and Sehome High Schools.

Restrictions to the Roy and Carol Ericsson Scholarship

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of \$1,000.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. A graduating senior from either Sehome or Bellingham High Schools in the following sequence:
 - 2007 – Sehome High student
 - 2008 – Bellingham High student
 - 2009 – Sehome High student
 - 2010 – Bellingham High student
 - 2011 – Sehome High student
 - B. A student planning to attend a community college after high school

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with Roy and Carol Ericsson, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Robert D. Frazier Memorial Scholarship

The Robert D Frazier Memorial Scholarship is a scholarship fund established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars honoring the life work of Robert D Frazier. A long-time educator, Bob Frazier was Principal of Bellingham High School from 1966 to 1973. He was committed to supporting and encouraging young people to get involved in high school activities and to achieve to their highest potential.

Restrictions to the Robert D Frazier Memorial Scholarship

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of \$1,000.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. A graduating senior (male or female) from Bellingham High School
 - B. Intending to pursue post-high school education at a four-year college/university
 - C. Involved in athletics in their high school career
 - D. Involved in high school activities (student government, service clubs, etc.)
3. **Application Procedures:** Interested and qualified students need to complete the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars application and submit it to the Bellingham High School Career Center by the specified deadline.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with The Frazier Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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W. Ingram Family BHS Scholarship

The W. Ingram Family Scholarship Fund was established with Bellingham Dollars for Scholars through the Celedo Fund of the Whatcom Community Foundation. Walt Ingram, retired commercial fisherman and former teacher, graduated from Brown University. Walt believes strongly in supporting young people to pursue their education.

The fund will award an annual scholarship of at least \$500. These monies can be used for tuition, books, and/or fees.

Selection criteria utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:

- A. A graduate of Bellingham High School
- B. Varsity sport participant
- C. Top 10% of Class
- D. Planning to attend an out-of-state liberal arts or science-oriented program

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Ingram Family, determines that specific changes are necessary.

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Paul Skaggs Memorial Scholarship

The Paul Skaggs Memorial Fund is a scholarship fund set up through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars in memory of Paul Skaggs, a former math teacher at Bellingham High School. Paul taught 30 years and was known for his patience with and dedication to students of all abilities to learn the concepts of math.

Restrictions to the Paul Skaggs Memorial Scholarship

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of \$1,000.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. Senior graduating from Bellingham High School.
 - B. Planning to attend either a community college or a 4-yr university/college after high school.
 - C. Planning to major in math/science education
 - D. GPA considered
 - E. Strong consideration given to academic improvement
 - F. Financial need considered

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Skaggs Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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LaVelle A. “Vel” West Memorial Scholarship

The Vel West Memorial Scholarship is a scholarship established through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars in memory of LaVelle “Vel” West, a former PE teacher and coach with the Bellingham School District. Vel grew up in LaGrande, OR, attended college at Washington State University where he played football. After earning his Bachelor’s Degree from WSU, he began his teaching and coaching career in Raymond, WA where he coached football and wrestling. From there, the family moved to Auburn, CA where he continued coaching and teaching. In 1972 Vel came to Bellingham High to serve as the Head Varsity Football Coach teach P.E. At BHS, Vel launched the weight training program and the soccer program, taught all types of P.E., and was head football coach for almost two decades. While he was an accomplished athlete and loved all sports, he also infused dance instruction into his PE classes. Known for his commitment to young people, his humor, his zest for life, and his ‘can-do’ attitude, he mentored and inspired many people (both students and his colleagues) throughout his teaching and coaching career.

The distributable amount of the Fund will be used to award one or more annual scholarships. These monies may be used for tuition, housing, books and/or fees.

Selection criteria utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:

- A. Senior graduate of Bellingham High School to attend any post-secondary institution
- B. Financial need
- C. GPA of 2.0 or better (GPA not biggest factor)

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the West Family (the Donors), determines that specific changes are necessary.

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BHS Class of 1953 Scholarship

The BHS Class of 1953 is a scholarship fund set up through Bellingham Dollars for Scholars. Alumni members of the Class of 1953 raise money throughout the community to support young people in the Bellingham schools.

Restrictions to the BHS Class of 1953 Scholarship

1. The Fund will award two annual scholarship of \$500 each.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. Senior graduating from one of the three Bellingham high schools:
 - 2006 to BHS student
 - 2007 to Sehome
 - 2008 to Squalicum
 - 2009 to BHS
 - 2010 to Sehome
 - 2011 to Squalicum
 - Etc.
 - B. Planning to attend either a technical, community or 4-yr university/college after high school.
 - C. Selection is not totally dependent upon GPA
 - D. Strong consideration given to academic improvement
 - E. Financial need considered

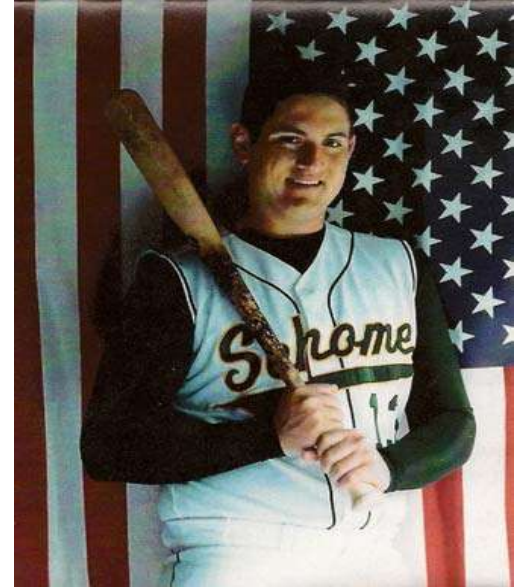

Restrictions to the Stephen A. Dember Award of Excellence

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of \$1,000.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. Applicant shall be a Sehome Senior Baseball Player
 - B. Demonstrates Academic Excellence and must be at or above a 3.0
 - C. Demonstrates Inspirational Leadership (team spirit) as a ball player
 - D. Demonstrates Community Involvement and/or Leadership
 - E. Has been accepted or plans to attend a four-year academic institution (or two-year if no four year applicant qualifies)
3. **Application Procedures:** In addition to completing the regular Bellingham Dollars for Scholars application, the student will submit:
 - A. One recommendation from each of the following four sources: a teacher or counselor, a coach, and a community leader.
 - B. 500-word essay on your vision for, values around, and a definition of excellence and inspirational leadership. Cite examples of who has inspired you and why, and how you have demonstrated excellence and inspirational leadership in the classroom, on the baseball field, at Sehome, and in the community.

The Dember family, in consultation with Coach Hatch, will make the final selection. Financial need will be considered only in the event that a tie between candidates should occur. Applicants need to turn these completed pieces in with the completed BDFS application to Sehome's Career Center by the deadline specified on the BDFS application.

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Dember Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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Kyle Roger Memorial/Class of 2009 Scholarship

Kyle Roger was a vibrant six-year old when it was discovered he had a rare brain stem tumor. Kyle had a love of life which was contagious to all who met him personally or heard about him. Kyle had an immeasurable drive and desire to succeed and conquer any obstacle he faced. He was an excellent athlete and student who excelled at anything he tried.

Kyle lost his fight against cancer on February 9, 2009 but the challenge he faced with the cancer was met with strength, relentless optimism and perseverance.

Kyle's memory will always inspire hope and the desire to help others among us.



Restrictions to the Kyle Roger Memorial/Class of 2009 Scholarship

The award will be a term scholarship with \$1,000 awarded to a male and \$1,000 awarded to a female until the term of \$4,000 is completed. **Donations and/or Fundraisers will be kindly accepted in order to extend the term of the Scholarship.*

1. Selection Criteria utilized in determining the recipient/s of the award shall be as follows:

- A. Applicant shall be a Squalicum High School Senior
- B. Planning to attend any post high school educational opportunities
- C. Selection committee places emphasis on personal integrity and love for life
- D. Demonstrate the drive and desire to succeed when faced with obstacles

2. Application Procedures: In addition to completing the regular Bellingham Dollars for Scholars application, the student will submit:

- A. A **short essay** discussing a specific time the applicant has faced a challenge and how they approached that challenge (maximum 500 words)
- B. **Two references/recommendations** that focus on the applicant's character
- C. A **Paragraph** describing the applicant's desire to succeed and conquer any obstacle that may arise

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Wade King Scholar-Athlete Scholarship

Wade King, a delightful 10-year old little boy, tragically lost his life in the horrific natural gas pipeline explosion that rocked the entire city of Bellingham in June 1999. Upon his death, his family established the Wade King Scholar-Athlete Scholarship intending to honor students who exemplified the same zest for life, athletic and academic excellence, and leadership qualities as Wade exhibited.

Restrictions to the Wade King Scholar-Athlete Scholarship

1. The Fund will award an annual scholarship of at least \$500.
2. **Selection criteria** utilized in determining the recipient of the award shall be as follows:
 - A. Senior graduating from one of Bellingham's four high schools (Bellingham, Squalicum, Sehome or Options)
 - B. Participation in high school athletics
 - C. Demonstrating a high Grade Point Average
 - D. Financial Need is considered

These restrictions shall remain in effect until the Bellingham Dollars for Scholars Chapter, in collaboration with the Beardsley Family, determines specific changes are necessary.

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
